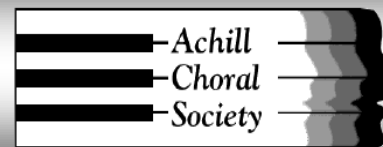


Achill Choral Society Presents Sounds of the Silver Screen
